
The CD programme pictured above is at the front entrance to the church, beside the statue of the Blessed Virgin.

From the Heart

"Hey, can you teach me how to do that?"
 "How to do what?" the chaplain asked.

We come to God on the basis of family relationship with Him.

Hallowed be your name

By praying this, we acknowledge that we might possibly misuse God's name for our selfish purposes. We don't want to do that.

Your kingdom come

We ask God to bring His peace and justice to the world. We recognize that we're not in charge. He is. We want His will done on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us each day our daily bread

This is simply a request for the essentials, not the luxuries we covet.

Forgive us our sins

Here is our biggest need. We all do wrong things out of selfish motives, and we all need forgiveness.

For we also forgive everyone who sins against us

This is the flip side of the forgiveness coin, and it implies an obligation to forgive others. We may need to ask God to help us give up our spirit of bitterness and our desire for revenge.

And lead us not into temptation

There's an enemy who seeks to destroy us. "Be alert and of sober mind. Your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour" (1 PETER 5:8). Without God's help, we're no match for the daily temptations we face.



It's fine to recite this prayer, but it isn't something we should do merely for good luck. In prayer, God wants us to share our deepest fears and heartfelt desires with Him.

And what are our deepest fears and desires? Often a crisis will clarify them. Without Christ, we're incapable of coping in a healthy way and may retreat into destructive habits. We want to know that life holds deeper meaning than what it seems to. The simple truth is we need God to make sense of life!

We need to find ways to build the trust fund to fulfill these requirements. People may ask “ Why donate to Msgr. Stephen Foerster Charity Welfare Trust when I can donate directly to charities of my choice?” However if you choose to donate to the trust fund we can then donate to certain organizations that allows us to apply for reimbursement from Supreme. These monies can then be given out again, multiplying your money. For instance if we give to local food banks we will receive from Supreme \$500 for every \$1000 donated. Our Trust Fund can issue taxable receipts like any other charity. I am asking member knights to consider making donations to our charity, the Monsignor Stephen Foerster Charity Welfare Trust, so we can continue to fulfil our goals.
